New Arsenal for Itchy Dogs

The weather is starting to clear up and the pollens and allergens are out in full force. Those with itchy allergic dogs might be noticing them scratching a lot more lately. As the weather continues to improve, our itchy dogs will be getting worse. Luckily we have a few new weapons in our arsenal against allergic skin disease, or atopy.

Apoquel, which is a safer alternative to prednisone, has been on the market for the last year or so. Apoquel works as effectively as prednisone but without all the nasty side effects that are common with long term prednisone use. Apoquel targets the cellular pathway that causes our animals to itch, while having minimal side effects on the rest of the body. It can be used as a daily treatment for severe allergies, or on an as needed basis for milder allergies.

Cytopoint, the newest allergy medication to come on the market, is a useful tool for atopic allergic dogs. Cytopoint is a fast acting injection that starts working within a day and is given every 4-8 weeks depending on response. It targets and neutralizes the specific chemical compound, or cytokine, in the body that is responsible for inducing itchiness in allergic dogs. In can be used alone or in combination with Apoquel to control atopic dermatitis but atopy must be diagnosed before. Obesity in Dogs and Cats

Just like us, our furry friends can suffer from obesity and weight problems. Thankfully we can have complete control over what our pets eat and how much they exercise. Obesity is the most common nutritional disorder our pets face, and can lead to a number of health problems including diabetes, hip dysplasia, arthritis, and cancer. Obese and overweight animals live an average of 3 years less than non-obese dogs and cats.

The best way to get our pets to lose weight is to increase the exercise they get and to reduce the amount of food they eat, including cutting down on treats and table scraps, or to switch to a weight loss diet such as Hill's Metabolic. We have a number of weight loss foods available in clinic and we are happy to devise a weight loss plan for your pet, including regular weight checks.

Slug Bait Toxicity

Slug bait is unfortunately a common poisoning seen by our Vet Centre Clinics especially at this time of year when our gardens are in full swing. Slugs can be a pest but the traditional commercial slug baits available are unfortunately extremely toxic and even fatal to your pet dogs.

Typical early signs to look out for after slug bait ingestion include incoordination (they may look and

act drunk!) and increased anxiety. You may notice your dog pacing and acting very strange and wobbly. This typically starts 30 to 60 minutes after they eat the bait. The signs quickly progress to severe muscle twitching, seizures, and increased drooling (more than usual for a big drooly dog!).

If your pets are not treated by this stage they can go in to comas and even die. Sadly slug bait can kill our furry friends within 2 to 12 hours depending on how much they have eaten. Your pets can survive slug bait ingestion if attended to immediately after ingestion or commencement of symptoms.

If you have seen or suspect your pet as eaten slug bait or notice any of the signs above they should receive immediate veterinary attention. Dogs that are treated early and survive the first 24 hours can make a full recovery in several days to weeks.
